

I. OLD BUSINESS

- A. Roll Call - The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m. without a quorum present.
- B. Approve December 11, 1990 Minutes - Tabled for March meeting.

II. NEW BUSINESS

- A. Guest: Daniel Guiney, from the Allegany County Attorney's Office, explained a Financial Disclosure Policy mandated by the State. He reviewed the format designed by the County to address this mandate. After a brief discussion, Mr. Krumm thanked Mr. Guiney for his presentation. Financial Disclosure forms will be sent to all Board Members soon for their response.
- B. Subcommittee Reports
 - 1. Developmental Disabilities met today. Mr. Krumm reported that J. N. Adam's closure has been moved from 1992 to 1993. This committee is looking for new members; Mr. Canuteson has suggested several individuals who may be interested.
 - 2. Alcohol/Substance Abuse will meet later this week. Mr. Krumm and Mr. Ballengee are soliciting members for the committee.
 - 3. Mental Health reported by Mr. Serafin. Last month, Mr. Ken Kolmar was invited. Discussion concerned children and adolescent services. Today's meeting covered three main topics: 1) Recommendations from RPAC panel; 2) Guidelines for 1992; 3) the threatened closure of Gowanda Psychiatric Center.

Regarding the closure, Mr. Serafin has been asked to work up an outpatient plan. There has to be more acute care beds in the community and more outpatient staff available to deal with the patients discharged to the community. The geriatric population must be addressed in at least two areas: at-home care and consultations in the nursing home facilities. Needs of children and youth must be addressed.

Mr. Serafin stated that one of the best examples of community care is the way Jackie Stevens and Jeannine Dugrenier handle it; this could be used as a role model on a larger scale.

There was a discussion period; Mr. Serafin asked for the Board's input for a letter he is composing to address GPC's closure.

- C. Director's Report - Dr. Anderson talked about the RPAC's disapproval of the 1991 plan. New RPAC guidelines are forthcoming. Robyn Meyer will be invited to the next Mental Health Subcommittee Meeting.
- D. Chairman's Log - Mr. Krumm asked Dr. Anderson about the Neighborhood Initiative Program. Linda Wells and John Mahinis (ARA, Inc.) are involved.

Dr. Anderson would like to invite Dr. Tartaglia to make a presentation on Geriatrics to the Mental Health Subcommittee. This would help in the planning for services for that population's mental health needs.

Mr. Krumm urged members to seek consumers to assist with the Local Government Plan (LGP) and/or become members of the Subcommittees and this Board.



I. OLD BUSINESS

- A. Roll Call-Meeting called to order at 7:05 p.m.
- B. Approve Minutes-Mr. Frair formed a motion to approve the minutes of December 11, 1990 and February 26, 1991. Seconded.

VOTE: Unanimous. CARRIED.

- C. Y.T.D. Reports-Mr. Ballengee from Allegany Council distributed his reports and gave a brief summary. After answering questions, he excused himself to attend the D.D.P. Meeting.

Mr. Jakovac summarized the Counseling Center report which had been mailed with the March agenda.

Mr. Witkowski of Allegany County ARC gave a verbal review of the ARC's activities. He noted that the 30th Anniversary of the ARC will be celebrated in June.

The Mental Health Association report was distributed with the March agenda; no representative was present at this meeting.

Mr. Sylor moved to accept all the reports as presented. Seconded.

II. NEW BUSINESS

A. Subcommittee Reports

1. Mental Health - Mr. Serafin reported that Robyn Meyer of the Buffalo Regional Mental Health Office was a guest at today's meeting. She explained RPAC's functions and plans for improving the use of the Local Government Plan in their entirety.

The next Mental Health Subcommittee meeting will focus on completion of the 1992 LGP.

2. DAAA-Mr. Krumm reported that Allegany Council had built some new offices into their building.
3. Developmental Disabilities-Mr. Krumm received a letter from Mr. Canuteson, Director, J. N. Adam, with some suggestions for possible members of this Subcommittee. These people were contacted by letter; four have responded. Mr. Gould from J.N. Adam Developmental Center attended the Subcommittee Meeting to talk about the "Aging-out" process which ensures that DD students, upon reaching age 21, are not "lost" from the system, but integrated into programs available to them in the area. The schools will be using form DDP IV to collect data on these students to help determine their needs.

- B. Executive Committee-A suggestion was made to invite guests to these Board Meetings. Margaret (Peggy) Cherre, Deputy Director of ACCORD (Allegany County Community Opportunity & Rural Development) will be invited to attend April's meeting; Martha McCarty, the Sexual Abuse Coordinator for the Counseling Center might be invited to the May meeting.





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

The Allegany County Community Services Board met on Tuesday, September 24, 1991 at the Counseling Center, 22 West State Street, Wellsville, NY.

I. OLD BUSINESS

A. Roll Call - Meeting was called to order at 7:10 p.m. without a quorum present.

B. Approve March 26, April 23 and June 25 Minutes - Tabled.

C. Year-to-Date Reports

1. Allegany Council - Rodney Ballengee reviewed Council activities. The following programs were discussed: Alcoholism Clinic Treatment, Prevention Education, Trapping Brook Residence, Supportive Living Program and the Drinking Driver Program.
2. ARC - Richard Witkowski reviewed ARC activities. PWI, Day Training, Residential, Respite, Crisis Intervention, Staff Development, Transportation and Finance and Development were discussed. Dr. Anderson will meet with Mr. Witkowski to develop a financial summary better understood by the Board.
3. Counseling Center - Leonard Jakovac reviewed mental health activities. The Counseling Center, Crisis Intervention, Sexual Abuse Treatment, Community Support Services, Staffing, Social Club and Financial Summary were discussed. There was a certification site visit from the Regional Office on September 20, 1991. New issued regulations will need to be followed.

4. Mental Health Association - Not represented.

Mr. Krumm thanked the Executive Directors for their excellent reports.

II. NEW BUSINESS

A. Subcommittee Reports

1. Alcohol - did not meet.
2. Developmental Disabilities - Gene Krumm and Bonnie Amidon talked about the Home and Community Based Services (HCBS). Bonnie asked the Subcommittee to support this program by being an advocate. There's a need to fill out forms and submit them to DDSO for approval. Clients will receive case management services.
3. Mental Health - William Serafin
There was a presentation from Steuben Church People Against Poverty (SCAP). STEL approached SCAP about housing needs in Allegany County but retained control. Three levels of certified beds are supportive apartments, intensive supportive residences and supervised residences. SCAP is looking for a Consumer Housing Specialist Assistant for Allegany County.

Mr. Serafin gave an update on GPC. As of 9/15/91 Allegany County was assigned to Willard. GPC will no longer accept admissions. Acute admissions will go to St. James or Olean General West and then to Willard. There is a geriatric problem. The mental health system needs to find a place for clients with organic problems who cannot be maintained in nursing homes.

RPAC is putting together a needs assessment to make sure people are properly serviced.

There is a vacancy on the Subcommittee. They would like to find someone who works with children.

B. Executive Committee - did not meet.

- C. Director's Report - Robert Anderson noted Doris will be retiring 11/22/91 after 28 years of service to Allegany County. Doris, supported by her husband, will be honored at the CSB Christmas Dinner meeting on 12/10/91 at 6:00 p.m. at the Old Mill Inn.

Dr. Anderson, Bob Wood and Ivan Canuteson had a meeting regarding mental health services for the dually diagnosed. Another meeting regarding the dually diagnosed was attended by GPC, Willard, J. N. Adam, ARC, Steuben County ARC and Community Services.

John Dedrick was hired as the Children and Youth Intensive Case Manager.





I. OLD BUSINESS

- A. Roll Call - Meeting was called to order at 8:30 p.m. by Vice Chairman, Albert VanderLinde, without a quorum present.
- B. Approve March 26, April 23, June 25, September 24 and October 29 Minutes - Tabled.
- C. Year-To-Date Reports - Mailed to Community Services Board Members.

II. NEW BUSINESS

A. Subcommittee Reports

1. Alcohol - Dr. VanderLinde read Mr. Krumm's report. The Alcohol Subcommittee met on 11/21/91 and reviewed the status of previous issues.
2. Developmental Disabilities - Dr. VanderLinde read Mr. Krumm's report. The Developmental Disabilities Subcommittee met on 11/19/91. The Advocacy Program with ARC was reviewed and information was sent to all Subcommittee Members asking for support. They will let us know if they are rejecting this program. This information is currently being collected.

3. Mental Health - Bill Serafin indicated that the Subcommittee met earlier today. They reviewed the RPAC recommendations for all counties. It was recommended that all counties become more sensitive to urban-rural issues. Dr. Anderson had pointed out inconsistencies.

ICM needs a walk-in center. Different types of supported and supportive housing were discussed. Jerry Scott will be invited to the next meeting. It was recommended that Willard and St. James have Consumer Advisory Boards.

- B. Executive Committee - did not meet.
- C. Director's Report - Due to dire fiscal status agencies will be advanced only state aid monies received. Reimbursement on vouchers will be timely. ARC paid the County \$93,775 in voluntary contributions and reimbursed County money owed. Dr. Anderson presented Doris J. Burdick with a plaque from the Community Services Board.


