- 1 Chairman Saylor called the meeting to order at 9:10 A.M. Motion by Mr. Wentworth to approve the minutes of December 18, 1990; seconded by Mr. Palmiter. Carried.
- 2 The Committee asked that Mr. Young write a letter to the Town of Wellsville asking what their plans are for the access road; will it be paved within one year from the time it is turned over to them?
- 3 Mr. Roeske brought to the attention of the Committee a grant available from the DEC called the Native Hardwood Demonstration Grant. The grant is for \$50,000 and it utilizes the local hardwood for timber decks. This amount would basically pay for the materials and we would reciprocate manpower and equipment. The grant must be in by January 31, 1991 with a commitment from Allegany County.
Motion by Mr. Loucks to approve applying for the grant from the DEC for Native Hardwood Utilization; seconded by Mr. Palmiter. Carried.

- 4 Mr. Roeske asked permission to go to bid on the bridge decks for this years program. He would send the bids out with a clause leaving the award date open for 90 days.
Motion by Mr. Loucks to go to bid on the bridge decks for the 1991 year; seconded by Mr. Palmiter. Carried.
- 5 Mr. Roeske asked Committee to approve for a resolution for the local share of the Construction cost and construction engineering cost on CR 11 - McHenry Valley for the amount of \$141,210.
Motion by Mr. Wentworth to go for resolution in the amount of \$141,210 for the local share of construction cost on CR 11 - McHenry Valley; seconded by Mr. Loucks. Carried.

RESOLUTION TO BE PREPARED BY THE COUNTY ATTORNEY

- 6 Mr. Young stated to the Committee that the County would be addressing the DEC order of consent soon. Taking care of the problem with errosion runoff management and reclamation and revegetation at the Almond sand pit.
Motion by Mr. Palmiter to have a Resolution to approve of the Highway Dept. taking care of the DEC order of consent for the Almond sand pit; seconded by Mr. Wentworth. Carried.

RESOLUTION TO BE PREPARED BY THE COUNTY ATTORNEY

- 7 Mr. Roeske requested permission from the Committee to hire a laborer in the District 5 shop resulting from the recent retirement in the Highway Department.
Motion by Mr. Palmiter to approve the hiring of the laborer to fill the open position in the District 5 shop; seconded by Mr. Wentworth. Carried.
- 8 Mr. Roeske gave the Committee the 1991 Town and County Bridge Program Report requesting their approval. He did mention that the Crawford Creek project had increased.
Motion by Mr. Loucks to have a resolution drawn up and approve the 1991 Town and County Bridge Program Report; seconded by Mr. Wentworth. Carried.

RESOLUTION TO BE PREPARED BY THE COUNTY ATTORNEY

- 9 Mr. Roeske informed the Committee that the hardware for the fuel system at the Soil Conservation has been delivered. He asked the Committee's permission to bid the removal of the old tanks.
Motion by Mr. Loucks to give permission to go to bid on the removal of the old fuel tanks at the Soil Conservation Building; seconded by Mr. Wentworth. Carried.

- 10 Mr. Roeske asked permission to bid the equipment requested and the Superintendent's car. Equipment being - 5- 3/4 T. Pickups; 2 - 1/2 T. Pickups; tar trailer; caps for the Foremans trucks; Superintendent's car; wheel loader; 10-wheel roll-off; 1-ton Mechanic service truck. The Committee approved of purchase of items under State Contract if prices were reasonable. Motion by Mr. Wentworth to approve going to bid on the equipment requested above; seconded by Mr. Palmiter. Carried.
- 11 Mr. Roeske requested permission to purchase two (2) pan tampers for Highway. Motion by Mr. Wentworth to approve the purchase of two pan tampers for Highway; seconded by Mr. Palmiter. Carried.
- 12 Mr. Roeske informed the Committee that he would like to award engineering projects to two firms for two separate bridges. Bridge # 11-5 on CR 13c in the Town of Burns he would like to award to Hunt Engineers in the amount of \$25,414; Bridge # 9-3 on CR 16 in the Town of Birdsall he would like to award to E & M Engineers in the amount of \$27,488. Motion by Mr. Loucks to approve the awards of engineering projects which includes design, parttime construction and inspection to the two firms as stated above; seconded by Mr. Palmiter. Carried.
- 13 Mr. Mancuso asked the Committee's permission to spot recycling containers at the Village of Wellsville's Highway Department as they will be starting a recycling program whereby they will pickup a different recyclable item each day curbside. Mr. Mancuso feels this will be too large of a quantity for the Wellsville Transfer Station to handle daily. Motion by Mr. Palmiter to approve putting containers at the Village of Wellsville's Highway Department for a trial period; seconded by Mr. Loucks. Carried.
- 14 Motion by Mr. Loucks to approve the Holiday Schedule for the Transfer Stations and Landfill; seconded by Mr. Palmiter. Carried.
- 15 Mr. Mancuso gave an update on the Recycling Law. He gave changes to the Attorney's Office; concerning the permit system; in December and hasn't had a reply. The Committee would like the Resolution approving the Recycling Law to go through the Board Meeting of January 28, 1991.

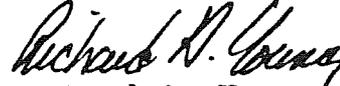

- It was the consensus of the Committee that permits would only be sold by Allegany County Department of Public Works personnel and not involve outside persons for the collection of funds for these permits. The Committee would like everything in place to start the recycling law sometime near March 1, 1991.
- 16 Mr. Young asked the Committee's permission to upgrade the Landfill Supervisor to the Non Unit Grade 13. The Committee asked that this matter be referred to the Personnel Committee to do a workup on the two supervisor positions at the landfill. Motion by Mr. Wentworth to refer to the Personnel Committee the upgrade of Landfill Supervisor; seconded by Mr. Loucks. Carried.
- 17 Chairman Cross suggested in the case of the Mental Health Building that Mr. Margeson be appointed to negotiate any deal that can be met. Motion by Mr. Wentworth to have the Administrative Assistant, Mr. John Margeson handle the Mental Health Building negotiation; seconded by Mr. Loucks. Carried.
- 18 Mr. Young brought back to Committee the Asbestos Abatement Contract from ASTECO. He would like a commitment from the Committee for the drawing up of the bid document and bid work at a cost of \$4,970. Motion by Mr. Wentworth to approve ASTECO writing the Bid documents and bidding the work at a cost of \$4,970; seconded by Mr. Palmiter. Carried.
- 19 Mr. Young asked the Committee's permission to hire a janitor for Buildings and Grounds. The Committee would like Mr. Young to talk with ARC about the possibility of using ARC clients for cleaning and odd jobs around the building at a lesser rate than someone might be hired for. They will then discuss the matter further at the next Public Works Meeting.
- 20 Motion by Mr. Wentworth to approve the prepaid Utility Audits for the dates of: 12/18/90; 12/21/90; 12/28/90; and 12/31/90; seconded by Mr. Palmiter. Carried.
- 21 Motion by Mr. Loucks to go into Executive Session at 11:16 A.M.; seconded by Mr. Wentworth. Carried.
- Motion by Mr. Palmiter to go out of Executive Session at 11:45 A.M.; seconded by Mr. Wentworth. Carried.

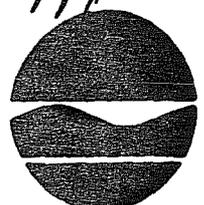

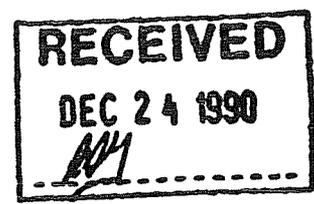

RESOLUTION

AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY OF ALLEGANY TO PARTICIPATE TO THE EXTENT OF 25% OF THE HBRR PORTION AND 24% OF THE FAS PORTION OF THE NON-FEDERAL SHARE IN THE COST OF CONSTRUCTION OF A FEDERAL-AID PROJECT NOT ON THE STATE HIGHWAY SYSTEM ADMINISTERED BY THE NEW YORK STATE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION.

WHEREAS, a Project for the reconstruction of County Road 11, McHenry Valley Road, D253612, PIN 6751.26 funded under a Federal-Aid Program, provided for in Title 23 U.S. Code, as amended, calls for the apportionment of costs for the program to be borne at the ratio of 80% Federal funds and 20% State or local funds for the HBRR portion and at a ratio of 75% Federal Funds and 25% State or Local Funds for the FAS portion. The State's participation will be limited to a maximum of \$280,000 and the Municipality will reimburse the State for all the non-Federal share of participating costs in excess of \$280,000 plus all of the non-participating costs; and

WHEREAS, the County of Allegany desires to advance the project by making a commitment for their portion of the cost construction of the project or portions of the project not on the State Highway System, including any construction engineering (inspection) costs.

NOW, THEREFORE, the County Board of Legislators, duly convened does hereby

RESOLVE, that the County Board of Legislators approves of the above subject project; and it is hereby further

RESOLVED, that the County Board of Legislators hereby authorizes the participation of the County of Allegany in the cost of the construction of the project or portions of the project not on the State Highway System [including any construction engineering (inspection) costs] by execution of a Certified Check to the order of the State Comptroller prior to award of the contract; and it is further

RESOLVED, that the sum of \$141,210 is hereby appropriated to cover the cost of its participation in the above phase of the project, and the County Treasurer is hereby authorized and directed to deposit such sum with the State Comptroller prior to award of the contract; and it is further

RESOLVED, that a copy of this resolution be filed with the State Commissioner of Transportation, it being understood that upon completion of the above project, the Commissioner of Transportation of the State of New York shall transmit to this County of Allegany a statement showing the actual costs and expenses of such work and shall notify the County of Allegany of the amount due from, or to be returned to the County of Allegany, as the case may be and that any sum due the State of New York shall be paid by the County of Allegany within ninety (90) days after the date of transmittal of said statement, and the funds therefore shall be raised according to the statutes in such cases made and provided, subject to the approval of the County Board of Legislators.

anyone or a firm.

Mr. Tom Barber of Belfast - self and CCAC - the \$10 fee
charge at the Transfer Station do we know the final status?

Mr. Sylor - The fee was passed at the last Board Meeting.

Mr. Barber questioned the fee

Mr. Young's Main concern is for recording who is dumping, the
fee is for a two year period (\$5 per year)

Mr. Sylor - if we didn't charge a fee we may have a household
of 5 different families using the same transfer station.

Mr. Barber - should be done on a per Cubic Yard Basis.

Mr. Al Hyde - Hillside Contracting - We are already paying
for this in our taxes so we shouldn't pay again a per cubic
yard charge - outside County people should be paying that.
He goes along with paying a registration fee not a cubic yard
fee.

Mr. Young - The law is to help with recycling

Mr. J. Barnes - self- Bolivar
Has anyone considered congestion at the Transfer Station.
He feels it is a problem and will be worse now with everyone
going there. How do you plan to enforce this? There is one
man at the Transfer Station and how can he keep track of
who's dumping what; no less checking for bumper stickers.

Another thing - you have a hard time enforcing laws now -
like the yard waste thing for one.

The Best solution would be shut down the Transfer Stations to regular waste and use them strickly for Recycling Centers and take all waste to the landfill. Set up a scale fee for those using the Landfill.

Have recycling start slow - go with fewer items - then lead up to 7 items. If you force people to wash cans and jars you will have a lot of mad people.

When you do go with it work with the haulers and give a good 30 days to get ready.

One more question about my truck where am I going to unload when it is full of recyclables will it have to done by hand?

Mr. Young - I have requested a position for the Wellsville Transfer Station our busiest Station - we have a bond to use to build a recycle building at the Landfill.

CROWN-Y & RRV will take bulk. All 7 items have a market value. We will work with you much closer now.

Mr. Barnes - have you thought of shutting down some of the Waste Transfer Stations?

Mr. Young - I agree that there are way too may Transfer Stations. We will address these things in the future.

Mr. Barnes - When will this all take place, the permits and such.

Mr. Young - June 1, 1991 is what we are hitting for. The law will be adopted right after this public hearing and I feel this will be a positive step.

Mr. Barber - You say you are looking at 10 years ahead but, thus far you are limited to 7 items. What is the Public Works Committee doing about increasing the items?

Mr. Young - It doesn't make sense to recycle things that don't have a market. I'm leary of the 7 we are recycling now. We can't evey get this facility to use recycled paper now.

Mr. Barber - What does that take?

Mr. Young - Well, you can't mandate it because some recycled paper won't work well in copiers.

Mr. Hyde - Is there anything in the future as a plant that receives these items and makes something of them. What can these things be used for.

Mr. Young - CROWN-Y will take all recycled items at a charge of \$20.00 per ton.

Mr. Wentworth - in 1990 4% of the population were recycling.

Mr. Hyde - It is all starting backwards we are butting up against concrete walls - we must set up a manufacturing system to take care of this.

Mr. Young - We are passing this law because DEC is asking to have a Solid Waste Law in place by 1992.

Mr. Hyde - CID is making money from it.

Mr. Young - but they are charging people for it.

Mr. Hyde - We have to look at it in a feasible way.

Mr. Sexton - Bolivar - You will have the small containers at Recycling centers - when everyone has to recycle.

Mr. Young - He might have to direct you to take it to the recycling center - CROWN-y or Railroad Valley.

Mr. Sexton - Your are going to stick it to the hauler.

Mr. Young - You will be able to dump at Railroad Valley if you are doing it under the County contract.

Mr. Sexton - if I have small loads will I have to store it.

Mr. Young - No, you should be able to dump it.

Mr. Sexton - glass can't be broken and paper can't be wet?

Ms. Johnson - the flyer says that for the safety of the Transfer Station Operator.

Mr. Young - it is still accepted

Mr. Sexton - if it gets wet what do we do?

Mr. Young - Then it might have to be landfilled

Mr. Sexton - Twice a month is set for recycling and you can't cancel

Mr. Young - You will have to landfill it.

Mr. Barber - Do you have any plans in future that stimulate entrepreneurship in recycling?

Mr. Saylor - We had one white goods person that found it not to be profitable and that's how far it got.

Mr. Barber - is the public going to be let known about a company moving into the area.

Mr. Young - someone is raising a deal about recycling that we can't really talk about now.

Mr. Walchli - It is a business deal so we can't let things be known until the deal is secured.

Mr. Wentworth - from what I hear no one is against the law just certain items. We are mandated to do this. It will be changing the next 10 years.

Mr. Loucks - We are trying to look ahead - we would like to promote private Enterprise.

Mr. Hyde - The problem we are making a law to recycle but not a law to manufacture recyclables.

Mr. Loucks - I agree that the government should get involved and tell people things will be a certain way - packaging etc.

Mr. Klein - Cuba - Allegany County is not alone - there are industries looking at this , both ends are working.

Mr. Young - a success we have had is in scrap metals - we are unloading a lot of metal out of the waste stream with a firm from Hornell.

Mr. Walchli - I have seen changes already - packaging - the public has to put the pressure on.

Mrs. Cross - We have to all remember that we are in a new venture and we have a lot to learn and there will be changes it is just a beginning.

Mr. Young - The law can change quickly that is the way it is written. If an item is not pushing then maybe we will have to drop that for a while.

Mr. Saylor - We will try to work with everyone.

Mr. Kelly - Where will the permits be sold?

Mr. Young - Permits will be sold at the Transfer Stations and the Landfill and sometimes at the Office.

Mr. Saylor - Anyone else have anything to say?

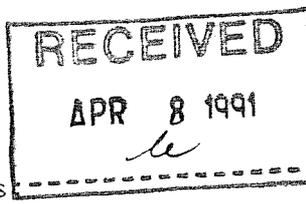

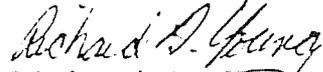

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS

As used in these rules and regulations:

1. "Board of Legislators" means the Board of Legislators of the County of Allegany.

2. "Committee" means the Public Works Committee of the Board of Legislators.

3. "Construction and Demolition Debris" means uncontaminated solid waste resulting from the construction, remodeling, repair and demolition of structures and roads; and uncontaminated solid waste consisting of vegetation resulting from land clearing and grubbing, utility line maintenance and seasonal and storm related cleanup. Such waste includes, but is not limited to: bricks, concrete and other masonry materials, soil, rock, wood, wall coverings, plaster, drywall, plumbing fixtures, non-asbestos insulation, roofing shingles, asphaltic pavement, glass, plastics that are not sealed in a manner that conceals other wastes, electrical wiring and components containing no hazardous liquids, and metals that are incidental to any of the above. Solid waste that is not construction and demolition debris (even if resulting from the construction, remodeling, repair and demolition of structures and roads and land clearing) includes, but is not limited to: asbestos wastes, garbage, corrugated container board, electrical fixtures containing hazardous liquids such as fluorescent light ballasts or transformers, carpeting, furniture, appliances, tires, drums and containers, and fuel tanks. Specifically excluded from the definition of construction and demolition debris is solid waste (including what otherwise would be construction and demolition debris) resulting from any processing technique, other than that employed at a construction and demolition processing facility, that renders individual waste components unrecognizable, such as pulverizing or shredding.

4. "County Facility" means a Solid Waste Management Facility owned or operated by the County of Allegany.

5. "D.E.C." means the Department of Environmental Conservation of the State of New York.

6. "Department" means the Allegany County Department of Public Works.

7. "ECL" means the Environmental Conservation Law of the State of New York.

8. "Hauler" means a person, corporate or individual, who collects and transports solid waste for disposal within the County of Allegany.

9. "Hazardous Waste" means "Hazardous Waste" pursuant to ECL Section 27-0901 and any Rules and Regulations promulgated by D.E.C. consistent therewith.

10. "Industrial Waste" means "Industrial-Commercial Waste" pursuant to ECL Section 27-0303 and any Rules and Regulations promulgated by D.E.C. consistent therewith.

11. "Resource Recovery" means the separation, extraction and recovery of usable materials, energy or heat from solid waste through source separation, recycling centers or other programs, projects or facilities.

12. "Solid Waste" means all putrescible and non-putrescible materials or substances discarded or rejected as being spent, useless, worthless or in excess to the owners at the time of such discard or rejection, including but not limited to garbage, refuse, industrial and commercial waste, sludges from air or water pollution control facilities, or water supply treatment facilities, rubbish, ashes, contained gaseous material, incinerator residue, demolition and construction debris, discarded automobiles and offal but not including sewage and other highly diluted water carried materials or substances and those in gaseous form.

13. "Solid Waste Management" means the purposeful and systematic transportation, storage, processing, recovery and disposal of solid waste.

14. "Solid Waste Management Facility" means any facility employed beyond the initial solid waste collection process including, but not limited to, transfer stations, baling facilities, rail haul or barge haul facilities, processing systems, including resource recovery facilities or other facilities for reducing solid waste volume, sanitary landfills, facilities for disposal of construction and demolition debris, plants and facilities for compacting, composting or

pyrolization of solid wastes, incinerators and other solid waste disposal, reduction or conversion facilities.

15. "Superintendent" means the Superintendent of Public Works of the County of Allegany.

SECTION 2. COMPLIANCE WITH RULES AND REGULATIONS

All haulers seeking to dispose of solid waste generated within the County of Allegany or offered for disposal within the County of Allegany shall be in compliance with these rules and regulations, County of Allegany Local Law No. 1 of 1991, the Laws of the State of New York, any rules and regulations promulgated pursuant to such Laws and shall otherwise be in compliance with all other laws and rules and regulations adopted by any governmental entity and applicable thereto. In particular, the Rules and Regulations of D.E.C. are incorporated herewith. The Superintendent, upon request, may require proof of such compliance including, but not limited to, copies of permits granted by D.E.C. or the Environmental Protection Agency of the United States Government.

SECTION 3. PERMITTING OF HAULERS

(a) All haulers shall obtain a permit from the Department before their use of any County Facility is allowed. Issuance of a permit to a hauler shall allow the hauler to offer for disposal and dispose of, at a County Facility, solid waste generated solely within the County of Allegany, or generated outside the County of Allegany when authorized by the Board of Legislators pursuant to section three of County of Allegany Local Law No. 1 of 1991, and acceptable for disposal pursuant to these rules and regulations. No hauler shall offer for disposal or dispose of solid waste inconsistent with these rules and regulations or with any other Federal, State or local law or any resolution of the Board of Legislators. Such inconsistent offering or disposal of solid waste shall constitute a violation of these rules and regulations.

(b) The Superintendent shall issue a permit consistent with these rules and regulations and County of Allegany Local Law No. 1 of 1991. Upon proper completion of the application form set forth as Appendix A below and payment of the permit fee, if any, a permit, in the form set forth as Appendix B below, shall be issued. In addition a bumper sticker, with a number shown thereon, shall be issued for each vehicle registered to the hauler and to be used by the hauler for delivery of solid waste to a County Facility and set forth in the application form; such sticker to be permanently affixed to the front bumper of each such vehicle. A permit shall be valid for two years from the issue date, but only so long as the holder of such permit is a hauler of solid waste generated within the County of Allegany, or generated outside the County of Allegany when such solid waste can be disposed of at a County Facility pursuant to authorization of the

Board of Legislators under section three of County of Allegany Local Law No. 1 of 1991, and acceptable for disposal pursuant to these rules and regulations. Permits and bumper stickers issued hereunder shall not be transferable.

(c) A hauler shall file a modification application anytime there is a change in the information contained in the original permit application.

(d) On and after the sixtieth day after these rules and regulations take effect, no hauler shall be allowed to offer for disposal and dispose of solid waste at a County Facility, as authorized by these rules and regulations, unless such hauler possesses and continues to possess a valid permit and valid bumper stickers issued pursuant to these rules and regulations.

(e) Permit applications and permits shall be available at times and places designated by the Department.

SECTION 4. WASTE ACCEPTABLE FOR DISPOSAL

(a) Except as limited below, solid waste generated within the County of Allegany may be disposed of at a County Facility. Except as limited below, solid waste generated outside the County of Allegany that the Board of Legislators may, from time to time as it sees fit in the public interest, permit to be disposed of at a County Facility, may be disposed of at a County Facility. The following solid waste may not be offered for disposal at or disposed of at any County Facility:

- (1) Hazardous waste in any quantity.
- (2) Any liquids and wastes including sludges, slurries, chemical or industrial wastes which are less than twenty per cent solids.
- (3) Any drum, pail, or other container which has not had the ends cut off and been crushed in accordance with D.E.C. Rules and Regulations. In addition, any container which had held hazardous waste and is not empty according to 40 United States Code of Federal Regulations 261.7(a)(3).
- (4) Industrial waste not approved for disposal by D.E.C.
- (5) All free liquids.
- (6) Batteries, as defined in paragraph (1) of subdivision (a) of section six of these rules and regulations, except at a County Facility designated by the Superintendent.
- (7) Grass clippings, leaves, small brush and ashes.

(8) Construction and demolition debris.

(9) Animal carcasses, except at a County Facility designated by the Superintendent.

(10) Any waste prohibited by D.E.C. in the operating permit or permits granted to the County of Allegany for a County Facility, or as may be otherwise prohibited or limited by D.E.C.

SECTION 5. SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF PERMIT

(a) In the event of a violation of these rules and regulations the permit issued by the Department to a hauler may be suspended or revoked by the Superintendent, after taking into consideration: the amount of solid waste that was offered for disposal or disposed of, the type or generation origin of waste that was offered for disposal or disposed of, and the number and frequency of prior violations. Prior to any suspension or revocation of a permit, the Superintendent shall conduct a hearing in which the Superintendent or the Superintendent's designee shall preside. At such hearing the Department shall have the burden of proof by a fair preponderance of the evidence. The hauler shall be permitted to be represented by counsel and to introduce evidence on the hauler's behalf. Adherence to the formal rules of evidence shall not be required.

(b) Following a determination by the Superintendent that he has probable cause to believe a violation has occurred of the within rules and regulations, he shall issue notice of probable cause concerning the violation to the permitted hauler. The Superintendent shall attempt to negotiate a course of remedial action to be taken by such hauler. A course of remedial action shall consist of that conduct to cause the violation to cease and desist and to compensate financially for any economic adverse consequences of the violation. In the event the Superintendent and the hauler fail to negotiate a course of remedial action within ten (10) days of the issuance of notice of probable cause, the Superintendent shall forthwith cause a hearing to be held upon written notice to the hauler, consistent with sub-section (a) of section five of these rules and regulations.

SECTION 6. RESOURCE RECOVERY

(a) As used in this section, the following definitions shall apply:

(1) "Batteries" shall mean lead-acid batteries, each with a capacity of six or more volts which contains lead and sulfuric acid and which is used as a power source in a vehicle.

(2) "Cans" shall mean containers comprised of aluminum, tin, steel, or a combination thereof, which formerly contained

only food and/or beverage substances. It shall not mean aerosol, paint, varnish or fuel cans.

(3) "Cardboard" shall mean woodpulp-based material which is usually smooth on both sides with a corrugated center. It shall also mean boxboard or paperboard having the same material and characteristics as cardboard, but without a corrugated center. It shall not mean wax-coated or glossy or soiled cardboard.

(4) "Glass" shall mean all clear (Flint), green, and brown (amber) colored glass containers. It shall not mean mirrors, auto glass, milk white glass, window glass, light bulbs, cookware, pyrex, crystal or ceramics.

(5) "Newspaper" shall mean newsprint and all newspapers and newspaper advertisements, supplements, comics and enclosures. It shall not mean magazines, books, telephone books, or glossy ads such as junk mail and newspaper inserts.

(6) "Plastic Containers" shall mean containers composed of high-density polyethylenes, polyethylene terephthalate, polyvinyl chloride or other specific plastics, not including styrofoam, that formerly contained the following in pourable form: food, food products, beverages, household cleaners or detergents, personal care products, automotive fluids, or shop or garden supplies. It shall not mean hard plastic containers or items, toys or dolls.

(7) "Recyclable material" shall mean any material which is used for its material recycling or reuse value.

(8) "Scrap metal" shall mean items comprised of any metal, but not including cans or white goods.

(9) "Separate" or "separated" shall mean the separation of the specified recyclable material from other solid waste and from any other recyclable materials.

(10) "Tires" shall mean tires from cars, trucks, and other vehicles.

(11) "Vehicle" shall mean any motor powered device which is self-propelled and designed for carrying persons or property or which is used for the transportation of persons, including, but not limited to, automobiles, buses, trucks, boats, motorcycles, snowmobiles and lawn and garden equipment.

(12) "White goods" shall mean major appliances such as refrigerators, freezers, water heaters, stoves, washing machines, dryers and dishwashers. It shall also mean metal heating or cooling systems.

(b) No recyclable material specified in this section nor any recyclable material specified in any rule or regulation adopted pursuant to County of Allegany Local Law No. 1 of 1991 shall be accepted for disposal or disposed of at any County Facility unless such recyclable material is separated, and prepared for disposal in accordance with the provisions of any administrative directive of the Superintendent issued pursuant to these rules and regulations.

(c) Separated recyclable materials which may be offered for disposal and disposed of at a County Facility designated by the provisions of any administrative directive of the Superintendent pursuant to these rules and regulations, are as follows:

- (1) Batteries.
- (2) Cans.
- (3) Cardboard.
- (4) Glass according to color. The colors are clear (flint), green, and brown (amber).
- (5) Newspapers.
- (6) Plastic containers.
- (7) Scrap metal.
- (8) Tires.
- (9) White goods.

SECTION 7. COUNTY FACILITIES: SUPERINTENDENT'S ADMINISTRATIVE AUTHORITY TO FIX HOURS OF OPERATION OF, DETERMINE ITEMS OF SOLID WASTE TO BE DISPOSED AT AND DETERMINE PREPARATION OF RECYCLABLE MATERIALS PRIOR TO DISPOSAL AT

(a) The Superintendent shall have the authority to fix the operating hours of each County Facility.

(b) The Superintendent shall have the authority to determine and designate the County Facility where items of solid waste, to include a recyclable material as defined in section six of these rules and regulations, may or will not be accepted for disposal.

(c) The Superintendent shall have the authority to determine and specify the preparation required for any recyclable material before any such recyclable material can be offered for disposal or disposed of at any County Facility.

(d) Exercise by the Superintendent of any authority granted under subdivisions (a), (b) and (c) of this section shall be done by administrative directive, shall be at the discretion of the Superintendent and shall not be deemed the promulgation of a rule or regulation.

(e) Any administrative directive shall be in writing, shall be published once in the official newspapers for notices as fixed by the Board of Legislators pursuant to law, and shall be conspicuously posted at each County Facility. An administrative directive shall take effect on the commencement of the next day following the day when both such publication and posting is accomplished unless a later effective date is determined and specified by the Superintendent in such directive.

(f) Any administrative directive may be published in any unofficial newspaper or non-newspaper as may be authorized by the Committee, and may be conspicuously posted in any other public place deemed appropriate by the Superintendent.

(g) Any such administrative directive shall be filed with the Department and a copy mailed or delivered to the Clerk of the Board of Legislators and Chairman of the Committee. The failure to file, mail or deliver such administrative directive shall not affect its validity.

SECTION 8. PAYMENT OF FEES FOR USE OF COUNTY FACILITIES

No credit will be accepted at any County Facility. All fees established by the Board of Legislators for the use of a County Facility shall be paid for in cash, or may be paid for by good check if the total fees are in excess of ten dollars.

SECTION 9. SEVERABILITY OF RULES AND REGULATIONS

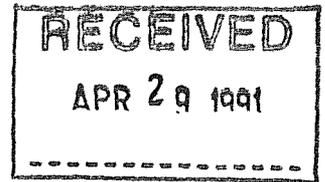
In the event a Section herein shall be determined to be unlawful or invalid, those Sections remaining shall be so sustaining and given separate enforcement without regard to those Sections declared unlawful or invalid.

2. That the Chairman of the Committee shall cause a copy of this resolution to be transmitted to the Clerk of the Board of Legislators for filing in order that the final rules and regulations will be effective on the tenth day after such filing excluding the day of filing.

The above titled resolution was adopted upon the affirmative vote of a majority of all regular members of the Public Works Committee of the Allegany County Board of Legislators at a regular meeting of the Committee held on April 2, 1991 at Belmont, New York.

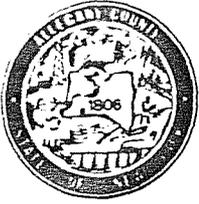

Decisions to be addressed for completing
Allegany County Comprehensive Recycling Analysis

A Comprehensive Recycling Analysis (CRA) is necessary to complete for two main reasons. For any NYS DEC permit application to be considered complete, an approved CRA is needed. Also, the information contained in a CRA is needed to complete the County's Solid Waste Management Plan.

If Allegany County wanted to construct a recyclables handling and recovery facility at any time in the future, an approved CRA is necessary as part of the construction permit application. Also, to renew any of the existing permits, an approved CRA is needed.

In June of 1990, a draft CRA was submitted to NYS DEC, which described the existing voluntary recycling program of Allegany County. A complete CRA must contain future plans for the County's Recycling Program for a period of at least 10 years.

The following is a list of questions and decisions that must be addressed to complete Allegany County's CRA.

- 1) Through planning and management, how will Allegany County achieve a reduction in the amount of solid waste destined for disposal? This plan must address and include the following:
 - a) Residential source separation and collection.
 - b) Intermediate processing.
 - c) Industrial and Commercial recyclables recovery.
 - d) Composting.
 - e) Public education efforts describing the benefits of reuse and recyclables recovery.
- 2) Allegany County must evaluate the recovery of recyclables through the existing program and make an assessment of the impact future program plans will make.
- 3) Allegany County must research available potential markets for recyclables through a market survey, including type of processing necessary, and available transportation.

- 4) Allegany County must identify a proposed plan for recyclables recovery from a documented list of alternate plans. Reasons for choosing the proposed plan must include information on extended capacity life of solid waste management facilities such as the landfill, incinerator, or a processing facility if applicable.
- 5) How will Allegany County fully implement the proposed recyclables recovery plan? The CRA must fully describe the following:
 - a) How is the program going to operate?
 - 1) What equipment will be used at a processing facility, transfer station, and at the curb?
 - 2) What are the collection plans at the curb, transfer stations, and a processing facility?
 - 3) How will recyclables be processed?
 - 4) What are the storage procedures?
 - 5) What are the market agreements and with whom?
 - 6) What funding sources will be used?
 - 7) Who is the entity responsible for program operation and management?
 - 8) What staff will be responsible for program implementation and enforcement?
 - 9) What is the schedule of implementation?
 - 10) What area will be serviced by the proposed plan?
 - 11) How will Allegany County enhance economic development for recycling markets within the service area?
 - 12) What public relation plans and education programs will be undertaken to help implement the proposed plan?
- 6) What local laws, ordinances and rules and regulations must be adopted to implement the proposed recyclables recovery program and enhance the economic development of recyclables market?
- 7) How will Allegany County possibly help further the State's Solid Waste Management hierarchy?
 - a) How does the proposed program reflect the hierarchy?
 - b) What plans does Allegany County have to procure materials with recycled content?

All of these questions must be addressed fully for a Comprehensive Recycling Analysis for Allegany County to be completed.

Re: Cattaraugus County Draft Solid Waste Management Plan

I have prepared Table KII to show the actual cost per ton of Cattaraugus County waste burned at the Cuba incinerator if Section 8.2.2 of the Solid Waste Management Plan is implemented.

The data from revised Table KI is used.

The following conditions are assumed:

1. the retrofit is approved 1/1/92
2. retrofitted plant starts operation 1/1/94
3. excess capacity is sold at \$55/ton
4. Appendix C cost analysis is used
5. an adjustment for ash cost above and below Appendix C figures is included.

Method:

The difference (Col. 8) between the average cost per ton (Col. 7) and the \$55 tipping fee is multiplied by the tons of waste burned from outside the County (Col. 3). The resultant dollars (Col. 9) are divided by the tons of Cattaraugus County waste burned (Col. 2). That resultant cost per ton (Col. 10) is added to the average cost per ton (Col. 7) to give the actual cost for each ton of Cattaraugus County waste burned (Col. 11)

Several examples are given to illustrate the effect on the costs per ton as more or less outside waste is burned. A series is shown for year 1992 even though the retrofit does not seem likely to be completed in 1992 or 1993.

Column 11 illustrates the rapid rise in per ton costs when operating even small amounts below full capacity.

If steam demand is less than maximum or outside waste supply is diminished or interrupted, high per ton costs are experienced.

An attempt to operate without any outside waste results in very high costs.

Paragraph 2 on Page 8-5 of the Solid Waste Management Plan erroneously states that small amounts of outside waste will reduce cost by approximately \$15/ton.

For example in year 1994 to even approach the cost per ton claimed in Appendix C, 1½ times as much outside waste as Cattaraugus County waste must be burned. In year 1995 the cost per ton in Appendix C is unattainable. As waste reduction and recycling programs mature the situation will become even more difficult.

These figures indicate that incinerator retrofit and use is not an economically viable option. The high dependence on outside waste introduces a high risk factor and makes cost control difficult at best.

Betty and I got rid of our back yard burn barrel 20 years ago, and it is time for Cattaraugus County to do the same.

The change will involve removing the outright ban on acceptance of construction and demolition debris and approving a limited list of types of C & D as well as limited quantities. The following types of C & D will not be accepted under any circumstances: bricks, concrete and other masonry materials, soil, rock, asphaltic pavement.

All other C & D as defined in the Rules and Regulations will be accepted under the following limitations:

2 Cubic yards per day per hauler, no single item shall be longer than three feet unless it is metal and recyclable.

A motion was made by Vander Linde, seconded by Gallman and carried, to transfer \$1,000 from Contingent Account No. A1990.4 to Sheriff Account No. A3110.4. County Attorney is requested to prepare a resolution.

The Sheriff also brought to the committees' attention the need to purchase more bunk beds for the jail at a total cost of \$3,000. He has \$1,300 in the account, and would need the balance of \$1,700 transferred from Contingent. A motion approving the purchase on behalf of the Public Safety Committee was made by Reuning, seconded by Watson and carried. A motion was made by Vander Linde, seconded by Gallman and carried, to authorize the transfer of \$1,700 from Contingent Account No. A1990.4 to Jail Account No. A3150.2 on behalf of the Ways and Means Committee. 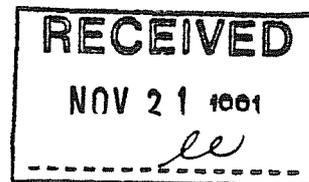

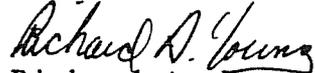

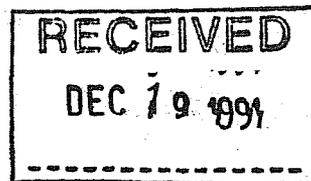
