

The Allegany County Community Services Board met on Tuesday, January 28, 1992 at the Counseling Center, 22 West State Street, Wellsville, N.Y.

I. OLD BUSINESS

- A. Roll Call - Meeting was called to order at 7:05 p.m. with a quorum present.
- B. Approve Minutes - Dr. VanderLinde made a motion to accept the 1991 Board minutes: March, April, June, September, October and December. Motion seconded by Sheila Gilmour.

VOTE: Unanimous CARRIED.

II. NEW BUSINESS

A. Subcommittee Reports

1. Alcohol - did not meet. Mr. Krumm reported that Allegany Council did not owe Allegany County any money at the close of 1991. Their budget was cut some. They are increasing their income by collections on past due accounts. Their insurance program now includes employee contributions and new deductions. The Youth Bureau and Allegany Council are working together on a program for youths. They teach youths to look out for each other and work together on substance abuse problems. Trapping Brook House does not conform to State agency fire codes. The State will update as required. The Supportive Living Program is doing well. Several clients are going to college, have jobs or return home to work. Rod Ballengee will be invited to the March CSB meeting to discuss this program. There's concern about clients who exit the program and require County social services support. The new Director of Prevention Education is doing an excellent job.

2. Developmental Disabilities - met on 1/21/92. Mr. Krumm reported that the Subcommittee agreed to be an advocate for several ARC clients in the Home and Community Based Services Program (HCBS). ARC's casemanager, Michelle Carl, discussed three clients. Most have been institutionalized most of their lives. This program provides services to clients to meet their individual needs, develop independence and facilitates social adjustments in the community. Small goals are set so they can be achieved. Some clients are not verbal. Plan progress is monitored by OMRDD. The next Subcommittee Meeting will be at the ARC to tour the new facility. ARC has scheduled training for volunteers who work with clients. Clients enjoy social activities with volunteers. Programs include visits to the zoo, bowling, eating out, etc. Clients like to be acknowledged in public.

ARC had an Open House at 240 O'Connor Street. Everyone is invited to visit all facilities at their convenience.

3. Mental Health - Met on 1/28/92. Mr. Serafin reported that Jerry Scott from the Regional Office was their guest. He deals with consumers on how to best provide for residential services.

Supervised Community Residence - single family home with 8-14 people, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Intensive Supportive - apartment scattered throughout an area or congregate care. Clients are visited once a day, 7 days a week.

Supportive apartment is visited 1 to 3 times a week.

Supported housing - only for financial support, no case-management.

HOME, Inc. (Housing Options Made Easy) is a consumer operated program covering four counties. They subsidize housing options. The Subcommittee discussed a drop-in center with a supportive apartment upstairs.

Residential services are included in the Plan. Funding may be a problem. Affiliation with a Not-for-Profit organization is necessary.

On February 6, 1992, there will be a Commissioner's law hearing at the David A. Howe Library. Two points to be addressed:

1. Is there a need for STEL to have a community residence in Wellsville, and
2. Will it change the character of the neighborhood?

The STEL Community Residence in Belmont would like to move to Wellsville.

Federal Housing Grants were discussed. Joyce Burns no longer has her crisis bed due to numerous problems including poor screenings.

- B. Executive Committee - did not meet.
- C. Director's Report - Dr. Anderson indicated that financial records for 1991 have been closed. We received extra money from the State - approximately \$42,000 for local assistance and \$16,000 CSS. The Annual Report is due 1/31/92. There will be a training session for CSB Members and all Subcommittee Members on February 28, 1992 at St. James Hospital in Hornell in conjunction with Steuben County. Lunch will be provided. The CSB Meeting was cancelled on February 25, 1992 in lieu of this training. The Mental Health Subcommittee will meet. Three state employees were hired for the Allegany County Crisis Team, which will provide 24 hour/day, 7 days a week service.



Dr. Anderson indicated that we do not have a certificate of occupancy due to village problems. We are adjusting to our new location.


- D. Chairman's Log - Eugene Krumm



The Allegany County Community Services Board met on Tuesday, May 26, 1992 at the Community Services office, 45 N. Broad Street, Wellsville.

I. OLD BUSINESS

- A. Roll Call - Meeting was called to order at 7:10 p.m. without a quorum present.
- B. Approve Minutes - Tabled, no quorum.

II. NEW BUSINESS

A. Subcommittee Reports

1. Alcohol - did not meet.
 2. Developmental Disabilities - Bonnie Amidon will complete the 1993 LGP.
 3. Mental Health - Mr. Serafin indicated that the Subcommittee did not have a quorum. Members present complimented Dr. Anderson on a great job writing the Mental Health 1993 LGP. He passed out a pamphlet "Private Trouble Public Challenges" to members. Next meeting will be in September.
- B. Executive Committee - did not meet.
- C. Director's Report - Dr. Anderson indicated that the 1993 LGP is an addendum to the 1992 LGP. High priority needs are for children and youth services and respite beds are needed. The needs of the geriatric population are not being met as

they were in the past due to the demise of the CASA Program and loss of the Geriatric Screening Team from GPC. There are reduced resources to provide needed services. The Adult ICM (state employee) and the C&Y ICM (county employee) continue to provide excellent services to Allegany County.

The Comprehensive Outpatient Program is the Counseling Center. The Crisis Team is shared staff with Willard. They provide 24 hours crisis services with face to face contacts. They have enhanced the quality of services in Allegany County. Seth Kolb from ARA provides excellent forensic services.

Dr. Anderson talked about the status of current service system, core service development and reallocation strategies. He relayed state psychiatric center utilization vs. acute care inpatient utilization and expected changes. He indicated long range goals are program development for children and youth, including day treatment, residential services, outpatient services and the expansion of clinic services to the geriatric population.

Dr. VanderLinde commended Dr. Anderson on the 1993 LGP.

Dr. Anderson met with Richard Orndoff, Regional Office; Community Services Directors from Willard, Elmira and Buffalo; and other County Directors to discuss mental health planning. They discussed the Managed Care System and Clinical Assistant Team.

Dr. Anderson met with Robert Chaffee, Billy Braun and the architect, Donald Reitz, regarding codes and regulations needed to get the Certificate of Occupancy for 45 N. Broad Street. If costs to meet regulations are too high, relocation of the Community Services office may be necessary.

There is a review of the 1993 LGP on June 22, 1992 at 9:30 a.m. at Geneseo College. The regional staff will review the plan and make recommendations.

Dr. Anderson met with Dr. Morgenfeld and Dick Thomas from the STEL Board to discuss STEL activities. He would like to invite Executive Director, Jerry Melville, to the CSB meeting in October to do a STEL presentation.

D. Chairman's Log

Other Business

Mr. Frair indicated that the Board of Health needs a doctor or psychologist on their Board due to Dr. Tartaglia's resignation.

There will not be a CSB meeting in June, July or August.

Meeting was adjourned at 8:00 p.m.

II. NEW BUSINESS

A. Subcommittee Reports

1. Alcohol - Eugene Krumm
Met in November. Although a license was obtained for a medical model drug based program, no funding is available because of a cut off date. An alternative chemical dependency program will be evaluated and hopefully lead to a drug funded program. A similar program is used in Batavia.

Financials for 1992 will be met as planned.

A one time year end separate and special payment was made in November to all employees including a 2.5% increase plus a longevity contribution.

Discussions will be held with award relative to developing private funding for a facility. There are no capital funds for facilities.

2. Developmental Disabilities - Eugene Krumm
Did not meet in November, however, an overview from the prior meeting is presented. The Medical Waiver Program will be used widely and include all case managers. A Day Rehabilitation Program will provide daily living skills development mostly in the home. Propose to hire a speech therapist to have in place sometime in 1993. Starting a family care program for 5-7 homes in 1993.

3. Mental Health - did not meet.

- B. Executive Committee - did not meet.

- C. Director's Report - Robert Anderson
Dr. Anderson will present a plaque to Mrs. Dominski in recognition of Donald Dominski's 7 years of dedicated service to the Community Services Board.

He complimented Mary Nevol on her fine job for the last year.

- D. Chairman's Report - Dr. VanderLinde
Dr. VanderLinde talked about his friendship with Mr. Dominski who was a very dedicated person.

Other

Mr. Witkowski, ARC, presented Mrs. Cross with a check for \$95,000 for 1992 voluntary contributions.

In 1993 there will be a final transition of J.N. Adam DDSO and the total demise of Gowanda Psychiatric Center.

Mrs. Cross indicated that she was impressed and it was remarkable the number of people in Allegany County being served by so few people. She is grateful for the excellent services for citizens of Allegany County. She indicated that there will be an Allegany County Newsletter for citizens to become aware of all the services available in Allegany County.

Mr. Jakovac indicated that ARA was 10 years old in 1992. In January, 1993 the Continuing Treatment Program will be 10 years old. He expressed appreciation for the support received from the CSB and Legislators.
