- 1 Chairman Palmiter opened the meeting at 9:35 A.M. Motion by Mr. Bennett to approve the minutes of December 6, 11, 18, and 26, 1995. Seconded by Mr. Sherman. Carried.
- 2 A motion was made by Mr. Bennett and seconded by Mr. Sherman to refer to Ways and Means to transfer of \$2,280.00 from Road Machinery Account DM5130.204 to Administration Account A1490.204. Transfer is needed to cover overage in budgeted amount of a vehicle purchase. Carried.

REFERRAL TO WAYS & MEANS

- 3 Mr. Young discussed the Corrective Action Plan which will be forwarded to J. Mulholland regarding future bid awards made by the Department of Public Works. He said tighter specs will be written.
- 4 Mr. Young informed committee that the Town of Centerville requested 120' of 24" pipe to be used for the January 6th event. The pipe is valued at \$2,000.00.
- 5 Mr. Young told committee that the Town of Caneadea is questioning why they would have to upfront money for the road work being done for them in 1996. They said the work was being done to correct a county problem. It was suggested that the Town could possibly takeover County Road 46 in lieu of the 15% payment for the road project. Mr. Bennett will present the idea to the town.
- 6 Mr. Roeske requested permission to prepare bids for a skid steer loader, a pickup, and a 1 ton truck. A motion was made by Mr. Sherman and seconded by Mr. Bennett to prepare bids. Carried.

- 7 Mr. Roeske requested resolutions be prepared approving the construction of bridges with the Towns of Wirt and Andover under the Town/County Bridge Program. A motion was made by Mr. Sherman and seconded by Mr. Bennett to have resolutions prepared for board acceptance. Carried.

- 8 Mr. Young informed committee of a request from Soil & Water Conservation for help on a project. They are doing work on a inlet to Cuba Lake on Munger Hollow. A large retention pond is being built. They would like the Department of Public Works' to drive approximately 95' of sheet piling. Soil & Water would pay for all costs. A motion was made by Mr. Bennett and seconded by Mr. Sherman to help with the project. Carried.

- 9 Mr. Young requested permission to reject the one bid received for the maintenance of county owned vehicles. He requested to rebid with a lowered amount for bid and performance deposits. Mr. Bennett moved to rebid; seconded by Mr. Sherman. Carried.

- 10 Solid Waste 10:00 A.M. bid opening as follows:

- 11 Mr. Guy James discussed a distribution prepared on information received from other counties regarding their Snow & Ice Contracts. Services provided to the towns by the county was also discussed.

The towns are having a meeting without county representatives on January 13 regarding the contract. A joint meeting will be schedules after.

- 12 Mr. Young requested permission to purchase a 1.75 cubic yard sander for the Solid Waste 4WD pickup. Four quotes were obtained with George & Swede submitting the low price of \$3,500.00. The sander will be utilized to do the county office building parking lots. A motion was made by Mr. Bennett and seconded by Mr. Sherman to purchase sander. Carried.

- 13 Mr. Mancuso requested permission to create a laborer position with a Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday schedule. A new position was funded in the 1996 budget. A motion was made by Mr. Bennett and seconded by Mr. Sherman to create the position. Carried.

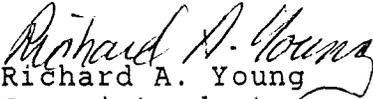

In accordance with Section 238 of the New York State Highway Law, I am submitting to the Board for its review a condition and feasibility report on the following Town System Bridge, to be constructed under the County/Town Bridge Cost-Sharing Program; as per County Resolution 127-85.

LOCATION/BRIDGE NUMBER:

Location: Mill Street, Town of Wirt

DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT:

EXISTING CONDITIONS:

The present structure is concrete encased steel beams with a concrete deck and concrete abutments. Most of the concrete is spalling and cracking. This structure is 33 feet in length and 24 feet in width. This structure was built in 1935.

PROPOSED CORRECTIVE ACTION:

It is proposed to construct a new structure on the existing alignment. Steel sheet piling will be utilized for the abutments and wingwalls. A panelized superstructure consisting of glu-laminated pressure-treated timber will comprise the superstructure.

JUSTIFICATION:

The concrete on the structure is deteriorating. This structure is presently posted for 18 tons. Mill Street is within the Village of Richburg and is used by school buses. Town trucks and residents of Richburg.

DETOUR:

There will be no on-site detour. Alternate route will be designated within the village.

DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT:

EXISTING CONDITIONS:

The present structure consists of steel I beams with a painted steel corrugated deck, the abutments are steel sheet-piling. The steel I beams have rusted completely through in many areas and the steel deck has numerous holes through it. This structure is 30 feet in length and is 23 feet wide and was built in 1969.

PROPOSED CORRECTIVE ACTION:

It is proposed to replace this structure on the existing alignment. Steel sheet piling will be utilized for the abutments and wingwalls. A longitudinal glu-laminated pressure-treated timber super-structure will be used.

JUSTIFICATION:

The steel on this structure is in serious condition. The beams and deck have rusted thru in several areas. This road serves as a school bus route, mail route, and emergency access for residences along the road.

DETOUR:

There will be an on-site detour consisting of all steel pipe with a gravel surface.

1. Chairman Palmiter opened the meeting at 9:05 a.m. Motion by Mr. Burdick to approve minutes of January 3, 1996, seconded by Mr. Bennett. Carried.
2. No question on the audit.
3. No transfers.
4. Flood Report - Mr. Walchli wanted to begin by thanking Dick Young, Dave Roeske, Guy James, and all County Highway employees for their efforts during this emergency. They worked very well with every agency involved. Mr. Young continued by saying he would like to commend all the employees in DPW for contributing their essential help. Mr. Bennett stated that Town Highway Crews should also be commended. Mr. Young added all volunteer agencies, fire departments, ambulances, etc., should be recognized for their efforts too. Mr. Young wanted Committee to know that NYS DEC Official, Kenneth Taft, has issued the County permission to enter the streams until September, 1996 to repair flood damage.

In regards to closing schools due to State of Emergency, John Walchli has authority to do so, with recommendation from whom, John Tucker?

REFERRAL TO WAYS AND MEANS

Mr. Burdick would like to know if FEMA pays 75% and the State 25%. This question is to be referred to John Tucker who is attending a meeting in Cuba this morning to discuss municipality reimbursement.

5. Drug & Alcohol Policy has been implemented and employees will be given a copy of the policy. The County will be dealing with OCCUMED of Western New York and Jones Memorial Hospital.
6. Filling of two positions - Permission to hire two employees granted with the understanding that if employee is hired for solid waste their hours will be Tuesday through Saturday.
7. Mr. Mancuso informed Committee that he would like to request a change in job classifications for one position in solid waste. Because one of his employees transferred to highway and another employee bidding that position it leaves a HMEO II position vacant. Mr. Mancuso would like permission to abolish one HMEO II position and create one HMEO I position at the landfill. Motion by Mr. Bennett to abolish one HMEO II position and create one HMEO I position with the stipulation that the hours be Tuesday through Saturday, if the position is at the solid waste facilities, seconded by Mr. Burdick. Carried.
8. Mr. Young stated in his Snow & Ice Report to Committee that there is still a waiting period to receive orders place to Cargill Salt, supposed to be 3-4 week delay is now longer. The order for Town's to only sand/salt intersections, hills and curves is still in effect on County Roads to try to conserve materials. Cargill is now getting salt from Akzo Salt in Livingston County and supplying it to the County. After discussing the current County snow plowing policy it was decided that negotiations with AFSCME are needed to have one person per truck instead of two.
9. Upon request of Mr. Bennett, Mr. Young wrote a letter to Miriam Morton regarding the bridge on CR 46, Town of Caneadea. This letter authorized a structural survey study to be completed and did not obligate the County to any type of action one way or another. After much discussion Mr. Bennett made a motion to appropriate a maximum amount of \$1,000.00 to pay for the study for the Bridge on CR 46, seconded by Mr. Burdick. Mr. Palmiter No, Mr. Graffrath No, Mr. Bennett Aye, Mr. Burdick, Aye, Mr. Sherman Aye 2 No 3 Aye Carried
10. McHenry Valley Issue - Letter from Skuba Construction Materials requested bridges on County Road 11 be repaired in 1996. It is not feasible at this time, costs from the flood are still unknown and the State cut the O&M (Operating & Maintenance) Budget. No action taken at this time to be submitted for consideration at the first meeting in June, 1996.

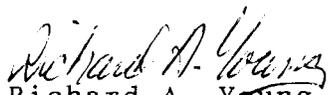

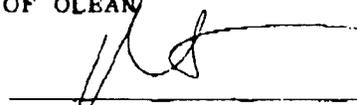

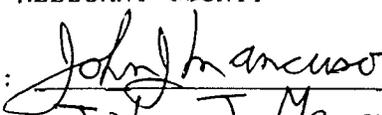

3. Johnson Controls gave a report on the electric - gas conversion and the cost savings to date. They have installed a energy monitoring system that is linked by modem it is set and operating correctly. When the old courthouse building project is completed it will be added to the existing energy monitoring system. The old boiler will be kept in reserve in case of an emergency situation. After questions and discussion on the project Mr. Burdick made a motion to accept the report from Johnson Controls seconded by Mr. Bennett. Carried.
4. Motion to approve previous minutes of February 7th, 9th, and 26th, made by Mr. Burdick and seconded by Mr. Bennett. Carried

5. Audit was approved.
6. No transfers.
7. Committee gave permission to have the yearly materials bid on April 3, at 11:00 a.m.
8. Mr. Roeske discussed the U.S.D.A. Natural Resources Conservative Service Flood Restoration Agreement and stated DPW would be working with Bob Pederson. Two of the projects scheduled are County Road 21 (Andover) Rip Rap and Stream restoration; County Road 4 (Hume) Botsford Hollow Bridge area, eight other projects are on the list and just need funding. Committee must approve and sign an agreement to participate in this program. Mr. Bennett made a motion to approve agreement, seconded by Mr. Burdick. Carried.
9. Mr. Roeske asked Committee approval for himself and Guy James to attend a Bridge Management Training Program by New York State Department of Transportation in Buffalo, the date is not known yet. Approval was granted for David Roeske and Guy James to attend.
10. Mr. Mancuso informed the Committee that there has been a problem with one of the compactors at Station 7 (Wellsville) and it may be more productive to replace that with a baler because this station generates 35% of all cardboard recycled in Allegany County. It was noted by Mr. Graffrath, that this station is very busy and it would be detrimental to remove the compactor and replace it with a baler. Another option proposed was to add a bay for the baler and move the recyclable containers in conjunction with widening upper area to improve public safety and convenience. After much discussion and several alternatives discussed Mr. Bennett made a motion for Mr. Mancuso to negotiate a lease price for baler seconded by Mr. Burdick. Carried
11. Mr. Mancuso reviewed the proposed changes for the Solid Waste Law and permits. The change for Wellsville will be closed on Monday instead of Thursday, the new schedule will be Tuesday through Saturday from 8:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. The change for Cuba/Friendship will be closed on Monday instead of Tuesday, the new schedule will be Tuesday 8:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Thursday 8:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. and Saturday 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. These changes will eliminate the stations closed on Monday Holidays and increase efficiency in the operations of the transfer station system because routine maintenance and baling can be done on Monday without disrupting public access. Motion by Mr. Burdick, seconded by Mr. Bennett and resolution carried to change transfer station schedule as recommended.
14. Mr. Mancuso asked for Committee approval to buy two recycling containers for Buildings & Grounds to use at the Courthouse. The cost would be \$3500 each and one would be paid by Solid Waste and one by Buildings & Grounds. Mr. Burdick made a motion to purchase the recycling containers, seconded by Mr. Bennett. Carried
15. Mr. Mancuso discussed the Town of Ossian and their contract to use the Canaseraga Transfer Station and inquired if Committee would like to continue allowing them to use Allegany County Facilities. After discussion Mr. Mancuso was instructed to establish a contract and present it to Committee for their approval.
16. Mr. Young informed Committee the Courthouse and E911 Project are scheduled for bid opening on March 14, at 10:00 a.m.
17. Mr. Young stated that funding for this project has not been approved yet.
18. Unfinished Business - Landfill Access Road - Attorney for private individual still delaying closing date.
19. Chairman Palmiter made a motion to go into Executive Session at 10:45 a.m.

Attached for your review is a summation of the project total anticipated costs. I have included all of the current low bidders. Based on the uncertainty of what we may find and the numerous questions raised by the contractors during the bidding stage, I have increased the recommended contingency to ten percent of the total anticipated cost. This increases the funding needed to a total of \$1,110,000.

I have reviewed the cost difference with my staff and as stated in the letters submitted for the individual contract awards, note the following items were introduced into the project during the final design stages and have had an influence on the total cost of the project:

1. Added the replacement of the passage roof between the Courthouse and Office Building.
2. Added Sink and Cabinets in the 911 addition.
3. Replaced the bulletproof glass in the Dispatch Office.
4. Replaced the water supply line from the Courthouse's new water service to the boiler room.
5. Added a buried conduit to the electrical service replacement between the Office Building and Courthouse.
6. Replaced the light fixtures in the Tax Office of the Courthouse.

In addition, concern was raised by the bidders that the cutting of oblong or rectangular shaped holes through the concrete floor slabs was not economical compared to round holes. When we looked at the cost estimates HUNT prepared, we did not account for this additional expense. We are optimistic we can negotiate a favorable change order to save on the many penetrations through the ground, first and second floor slabs. The overall cost of the project is reasonable when compared to similar rehabilitation projects and square foot cost estimating literature such as Means.

I am prepared to attend your Public Works Committee Meeting on April 3, 1996 to review this information with them.

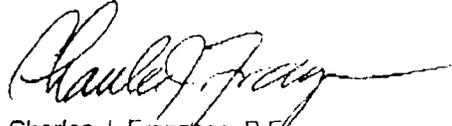

- 1 Chairman Palmiter opened the meeting at 9:07 A.M. Motion by Mr. Bennett to approve the minutes of March 6 and 25, 1996. Seconded by Mr. Burdick. Carried.
- 2 A motion was made by Mr. Burdick and seconded by Mr. Sherman to refer to Ways and Means to transfer of \$6,709.00 from Road Machinery Account DM5130.204 to Traffic Account D3310.204. Transfer is needed to cover overage in budgeted amount of a vehicle purchase. Carried.

REFERRAL TO WAYS & MEANS

- 3 Mr. Charles Franzese of Hunt Engineers gave an update on the bids opened on March 14 for the courthouse renovations. The total bids came in approximately \$127,000 over budget. There were various extras included in the bid which were not originally budgeted. He recommended awarding to the 3 low bidders; Duggan & Duggan, GC for the general contracting, William T. Spader Co. for the mechanical and G.V.E. Inc. for the electrical. There was a substantial difference between the two bids received for electrical work and G.V.E was told there would be no change orders to the contract. He said the total project would be 1.1 million dollars.

Mr. Burdick moved to accept the recommendations and proceed with the project. Motion seconded by Mr. Bennett. Carried.

Mr. Franzese requested that the county start looking at a place on the grounds for a staging area and field office for the contractors.

(#3 Cont.)

He noted one problem in the bid, which was a small expansion tank in the boiler room was left out of the bid and drawings. The cost of the tank will be around \$200.00. He will report back on the specifics.

- 4 Mr. Roeske request permission to hire out the cutting down of 10 trees in the back parking lot of the County Office Building. Work will be done on a Saturday. A motion was made by Mr. Burdick and seconded by Mr. Graffrath to proceed as requested. Carried.
- 5 Mr. Roeske a resolution approving an agreement with New York State DOT for Federal Emergency Relief for the January flooding. This would be in addition to the previous agreement with the State. If the work was completed by June, 100% or approximately \$60,000 would be received on various projects. A motion was made by Mr. Graffrath approving agreement. Motion was seconded by Mr. Sherman. Carried.

- 7 Mr. Roeske and Mr. Mancuso requested permission to purchase 2 welders, one for Highway and one for Solid Waste. A motion was made by Mr. Sherman and seconded by Mr. Burdick to purchase welders. Carried.
- 8 Mr. Roeske informed committee that due to the Federal and State budgets not being passed CHIPS funding could be held up. It will have to be determined if the paving program should be started without these budgets in place. It was noted that the 1996 O&M portion of CHIPS was reduced by approximately \$95,000 which will cause the surface treatment program to be reduced.
- 9 Mr. Mancuso distributed a new transfer station schedule which will become effective June 3, 1996. The changes affect the Cuba/Friendship and Wellsville stations. The changes will be advertised.

Mr. Walchli would like to see changes in the design of the Wellsville station due to traffic flow problems. The station could see additional traffic if the Village of Wellsville discontinues garbage collection.

- 10 Mr. Mancuso discussed a draft on changes for the permit system. A notice will be mailed to existing permit holders notifying them of the changes. A new permit will have to be obtained and would expire 5 years from issue date. New permits would still be sold at \$10.00 each. He would like to the new system start July 1, 1996. A hanging tag will be issued.

It was questioned whether commercial haulers could be charged differently. Mr. Mancuso said that defining this group would be difficult and that language was already in place to deal with noncompliance with the Solid Waste Law.

- 11 Ms. Gretchen Gary discussed recycling programs in the schools. Each school was visited extensively and rated on their program. An inspection was done in November of 1995 and she was disappointed as very little or no recycling was being done. The schools were told that a formal inspection would be done in 1996 and a information was provide to them. She has since seen a definite improvement.

The schools will be the first place to start enforcing recycling. The county offered to pay for 1/2 of the cost of small recycling containers to be used in schools. Schools should have many items being recycled.

Some of the blame is to be put on the haulers who are collecting the recyclables with the regular garbage. The Solid Waste law needs to be used, fines should be issued and permits revoked.

Ms. Gary noted that Consolidated Disposal of Whitesville was very good and put forth a good effort in providing schools with materials for recycling.

Mr. Graffrath was concerned with extra litter if the laws were enforced.

Ms. Gary said that those schools who put an effort into their recycling program found they could renegotiate their hauling contracts due to a reduction in their waste.

- 12 Mr. Gary discussed the new contract for cardboard recycling. Previously it was being sent to Fibercel in Portville, but due to operations change they could no longer take the cardboard. She solicited prices throughout the area and secured a new agreement with Solvay Paper. The floor price will be guaranteed and transportation is provided.

Mr. Burdick has spoken to Fibercel and was assured that the county was providing them with good quality cardboard. It was a corporate decision, not made in Portville to switch to cardboard clippings. He noted that everyone at the county level has done a good job.

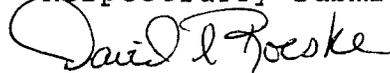

- 5 A referral from the Resource Management Committee requesting Public Works investigate a request to cutback road banks on SR70 and CR24 was discussed. Swain Ski Center would like to put a lighted sign up at the intersection.

A motion was made by Mr. Bennett and seconded by Mr. Burdick refer to NYSDOT on the matter. Carried.

- 6 A pipe problem in Swain also referred from Resource Management was reviewed. The area is an environmental area with the stream coming from Garwoods being protected and cannot be cleaned.

- 7 An update was given on a meeting with the "Save the Bridge" Committee and Dr. Abba Lichtenstein, P.E. regarding the Caneadea bridge. Dr. Lichtenstein thought the bridge was fine and could be repaired. NYSDOT disagreed and did not recommend load testing the bridge. They also stated they have no funds to repair the bridge. The state offered to refer to the research division in Albany to fund a level 1 test at an approximate cost of \$30,000 - \$40,000. Committee decided not to proceed with any future testing of the bridge.

- 8 Mr. Roeske informed committee that a bridge on CR17, White Creek had been closed. The bridge was being planned to be replaced in 1997. A bridge on CR29 which is in the 1996 budget is of similar size. Mr. Roeske recommended to do the CR17 bridge in 1996 and the CR29 bridge in 1997. He noted that the CR17 bridge will cost more, due to a substantial check dam which will have to be installed. FEMA will only make reimbursement for rip rap and concrete.

A motion was made by Mr. Burdick and seconded by Mr. Graffrath to make the change in the bridge schedule. Carried.

RESOLUTION TO BE PREPARED BY COUNTY ATTORNEY

- 9 Mr. Roeske requested permission to look into lease purchasing an 8 foot lowboy trailer due to extensive repairs necessary to the 10 foot trailer currently being used. He will come back to committee with final cost figures.
- 10 Mr. Young said that CHIPS capital funding was still uncertain.
- 11 The price of future salt purchases was discussed.
- 12 Mr. Roeske informed committee that ten hour work days for the County Road employees would begin on May 13 and end at the end of August.

- 13 Mr. Bennett commended Guy James for his hard work and long hours on the hazard mitigation program for FEMA. Mr. James was appointed the coordinator for all of Allegany County.

Mr. Young additionally commended the work efforts of all Public Works employees during the flood and those employees who did the plowing of county roads this winter. Committee members mentioned that only good comments were heard about the work.

- 14 Mr. Roeske requested permission for himself and Guy James to attend a wooden bridge conference in Wisconsin. It will be held October 23 - 25 and will cost \$85 per person plus motel and travel expenses. He noted that one third of the county bridges are wooden and there is a need to keep up with current design and testing methods.

A motion was made by Mr. Burdick and seconded by Mr. Sherman granting permission for those requested to attend. Carried.

- 15 A motion was made by Mr. Bennett and seconded by Mr. Sherman to hire summer help as requested by Mr. Roeske. Carried.

- 16 A letter received from adjacent property owners to the Friendship shop was discussed. The property owners complained of an objectionable smell coming from the bridge decks being stored there. They were also concerned over possible contamination coming from the preservative used on the wooden decks. A letter will be sent to the property owners assuring them of no contamination. The Material Data Safety Sheet for the preservative will also be sent. Storing the decks in a different location will be looked into.

- 17 Mr. Mancuso informed committee there was an immediate concern to replace the garbage compactor at the Wellsville transfer station. The compactor is worn out and a reliable one is needed in Wellsville due to the high volume at the station. He would like to replace the compactor at an estimated cost of \$30,000.00, however there are no funds budgeted to do so. Some of the funds could come from the .1 accounts in Solid Waste.

A motion was made by Mr. Burdick and seconded by Mr. Bennett to refer to Ways & Means for funding. Carried.

REFERRAL TO WAYS & MEANS

- 18 Mr. Mancuso requested permission to bid the installation of a chain link fence to be placed around the leachate pond and the second half of the Friendship Shop property. A motion was made by Mr. Bennett and seconded by Mr. Sherman to proceed with bidding. Carried.

- 19 Mr. Ray Walters of Earth Watch gave a proposal to committee on Alternative Daily Cover to be used at the landfill. The county would be paid to take in approximately 100 tons of "auto fluff" daily. Earth Watch will guarantee an available volume and has a flexible contract period. They currently have contracts with other counties. The auto fluff could be used as an alternative to Posi-shell which does not hold up in bad weather. The fluff also compresses better than dirt. Mr. Walters also said his company could also bring in contaminated soil.
- A motion was made by Mr. Graffrath and seconded by Mr. Sherman to enter into negotiations with Earth Watch. Carried.
- 20 Mr. Young passed around a brochure for a possible directory to be used in the county office buildings. Prices on various models will be brought back to committee.
- 21 Mr. Young distributed a report from RG&E on a energy partners program. Additional energy saving measures could be taken in county buildings.
- 22 Mr. Young said there is a pre-construction meeting with the contractors on the courthouse building project scheduled for Friday, May 3 at 10:00.
- 23 A request for a security door with bullet proof glass for the Support building was discussed. There has been many confrontational problems due to a new law being passed. A motion was made by Mr. Bennett and seconded by Mr. Burdick to proceed with the door purchase with Social Services providing the funding. Carried.
- 24 A request for a bullet proof door the District Attorney's office was reviewed. Committee felt security was adequate. Mr. Bennett said there was a need for measures to handle a situation once it occurs. The request was denied.
- 25 A motion was made by Mr. Bennett to go into Executive Session at 11:20. Motion seconded by Mr. Graffrath. Carried.
- A motion was made by Mr. Graffrath and seconded by Mr. Bennett to go out of Executive Session at 11:50. Carried.
- 26 A motion was made by Mr. Bennett and seconded by Mr. Burdick to create a Road Maintenance Supervisor position. Carried.

 1. That the following fees for permits and for the disposal of solid waste at any County Facility defined in Local Law No. 1 of 1991 are hereby established:
 - a. ten dollars for each original fee issued to include the first permit tag issued under such permit.
 - b. ten dollars for each permit tag, after the first, issued under an original, a renewal or a modified permit.
 - c. no fee for the issuance of a renewal or modified permit.
2. This resolution shall take effect September 1, 1996.

NOTICE is hereby given that a public hearing on the proposed rules and regulations set forth below will be held before the Public Works Committee at the above meeting at the stated date and place at 10:00 A.M., at which time all interested persons will be heard. A copy of the proposed rules and regulations set forth below may be obtained at the Public Works Department, Room 210, County Office Building, Belmont, New York.

The proposed rules and regulations are as follows:

Sixth Amendment of Superintendent of Public Works' Rules and Regulations for the Maintenance and Operation of Allegany County's Solid Waste Management and Resource Recovery

First: Subdivisions (b), (c), (d) and (e) of Section 3. of Superintendent of Public Works' Rules and Regulations for the Maintenance and Operation of Allegany County's Solid Waste Management and Resource Recovery are amended to read as follows:

(b) The Superintendent shall issue a permit consistent with these rules and regulations and County of Allegany Local Law No. 1 of 1991. Upon proper completion by the hauler of the form set forth as Appendix A below and payment of the permit fee, if any, a permit, in the form set forth in Appendix A below, shall be validated by the Superintendent and issued to the hauler. In addition, a permit tag with the issued permit number and date of permit expiration shown thereon together with such other data shown thereon as the Superintendent deems necessary, shall be issued with each permit. Each hauler may obtain no more than one additional permit tag after payment of any required fee unless, in the sole discretion of the Superintendent upon good cause shown by the hauler to the Superintendent, additional permit tags are allowed and issued to the hauler after payment of any required fees. A permit issued with a valid date commencing on or after September 1, 1996, shall expire August 31, 2001. A permit issued with a valid date commencing on or after the 1st day of September thereafter and on or after the 1st day of September of each fifth September thereafter shall expire each respective fifth August 31st thereafter. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a permit shall be valid only so long as the holder of such permit is a hauler of solid waste generated within the County of Allegany or generated outside the County of Allegany when such solid waste can be disposed of at a County Facility pursuant to authorization of the Board of Legislators under section three of County of Allegany Local

Law No. 1 of 1991, and acceptable for disposal pursuant to these rules and regulations. Permits and permit tags issued hereunder shall not be transferable.

(c) A hauler shall obtain a permit modification any time the hauler's name is legally changed or the hauler's legal or county address changes.

(d) No hauler may offer for disposal and dispose of solid waste at a County Facility, as authorized by these rules and regulations, unless such hauler possesses and continues to possess a valid permit and valid permit tags issued pursuant to these rules and regulations. The valid permit or valid permit tag, or both, shall be presented by the hauler to an operator of a County Facility at the time of delivery of solid waste for disposal at such County Facility, as requested by such operator.

(e) Permits and permit tags shall be available at times and places designated by the Department.

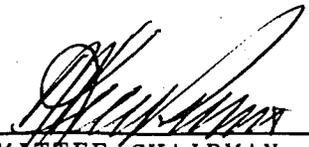

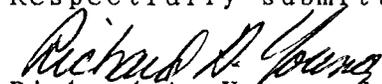

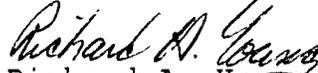

Where as; Maintaining a good working relationship with each Town and the NYS DOT is in the best interest of all Allegany County tax payers.

Where as; All Town, County and State agencies are funded by tax dollars, the loaning of man power between the various public agencies is a benefit to Allegany County.

Where as; All Town, County, and State equipment is bought and paid for by public tax dollars and the loaning of this equipment between the public agencies, when available is an asset to all those agencies involved.

Presently it is in the public interest and in the interest of the County Of Allegany to allow for the loaning of both man power and equipment to any of the Villages, Towns, or State DOT. When available and approved by the Superintendent or his designee.

The current equipment loan agreement will be signed by the various public Agencies involved in each case as needed.

2. Purchases—Persons authorized

The county superintendent of highways and not the county purchasing agent is empowered to purchase supplies for highway construction under this section. *Eastern Rocks Products Co., Inc. v. Mayer*, 1930, 137 Misc. 555, 244 N.Y.S. 96.

Pursuant to subdivision 2 of section 408 of the County Law, the board of supervisors may authorize the centralized purchase of gasoline, except for highway purposes, by the clerk of the board of supervisors. 10 Op.State Compt. 106, 1954.

3. — Amounts over \$1,000

Subdivision 4 of this section requires that any purchase of new machinery, chargeable to the county road machinery fund, in excess of \$1,000 in order to be effective, must have the approval of the board of supervisors or a committee of the board duly authorized and designated by the board for such purpose. 15 Op.State Compt. 252, 1959.

Purchases chargeable to county road machinery fund by county superintendent which involve an expenditure of more than \$1,000 must be made after competitive bidding in

compliance with section 103 of the General Municipal Law. 10 Op.State Compt. 62, 1954.

On and after January 1, 1951, all purchases of supplies and equipment by county superintendents chargeable to the county road machinery fund, which involve an expenditure of more than \$1,000, except in case of emergency, must be by contract let to lowest responsible bidder upon sealed bids after public advertisement of at least five days. 6 Op.State Compt. 409, 1950.

4. Garage construction costs

Cost of construction of county highway garage may be paid from funds of county road machinery fund. 1 Op.State Compt. 191, 1945.

5. Disposal of equipment

Except as otherwise expressly provided by law, the method of selling or otherwise disposing of county personal property not required for public use is to be prescribed by rule or regulation of the board of supervisors. 7 Op.State Compt. 370, 1951.

6. Private use of equipment

Town superintendent may not use town highway machinery for private individuals if compensation is received therefor by the town. 3 Op.State Compt. 234, 1947.

§ 133-a. Rental or hiring of county highway machinery, tools or equipment

The board of supervisors or county legislature of any county may, on the recommendation of the county superintendent of highways, permit the use of any county-owned street or highway machinery, tools or equipment, by any municipal corporation, political subdivision, district, district corporation or school district located within the state, upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed upon by the parties involved. Moneys received by a county pursuant to the provisions of this section shall be paid into the county road machinery fund.

Historical Note

1. Gravel processing agreements

A county may enter into agreements with towns, pursuant to the provisions of this article, for the processing of gravel in the county's processing plant and the consideration for such an agreement could be for a fixed charge per yard of processed gravel based on the hourly rental rate, the cost of the operator's salary

2. Use of rental proceeds

A board of supervisors may not earmark or freeze moneys received by a county for the rental of county owned highway machinery, equipment, tools and implements for the purpose of redeeming a capital note issued to finance the purchase of highway machinery. 3 Op.State Compt. 473, 1947.

§ 134. Purchases by county purchasing agent

Notwithstanding any other provisions of this article any county may, by a resolution of its board of supervisors regularly adopted, provide that all, or any part or class of supplies, materials, tools, implements and equipment, including purchase or rental of road machinery, required for any purpose authorized in this article, shall be purchased or contracted for by the county purchasing agent in the manner provided by law.

Pursuant To Highway Law Section 131-K

WHEREAS, the County Public Works Department has advised this board that many roads need to be repaired, and

WHEREAS, such roads are traveled over by citizens of the County, and

WHEREAS, the health, safety and welfare of the citizens of the County are of prime concern to this Board, and

WHEREAS, the continuous use of such roads by such citizens puts in jeopardy the health, safety and welfare of such citizens, and

WHEREAS, the Towns lack the skill, manpower and funds to extensively improve such roads, and

WHEREAS, the County possesses the skill, manpower and funds to assist the Towns in constructing or improving their Roads, and

WHEREAS, Section 131K of the Highway Law provides, in effect, that the costs of construction or improvement pursuant to such section shall be apportioned by this Board between the County and the Town in which such Road is located, and

WHEREAS, this board feels that a plan for the sharing of costs of such roads would help both the County and the Towns in budgeting funds for such costs, now, therefore, be it

WHEREAS, the County Superintendent shall report and advise this board of the circumstances which would involve the county in the repair of a town road.

It shall be the duty of the board of supervisors to cause to be raised annually in each fiscal year by tax upon the taxable property of said county in the same manner as other taxes are levied and collected, a sufficient sum to pay the principal of and interest on any bonds or notes issued to carry out the provisions of this section. It shall also be the duty of said board of supervisors in like manner to cause to be raised annually in each fiscal year a sum sufficient to pay all charges and expenses legally chargeable against the county for the care, maintenance and operation of any public improvement created as specified in this section.

The legislative body of a county may, upon consent of the governing body of any municipality situated in such county, provide for the construction, reconstruction or improvement of any highway, bridge or culvert or section thereof connecting county or state highways or highways improved pursuant to sections one hundred ninety-five or one hundred ninety-six of the highway law or which is an arterial situated within such municipality and deemed by the county legislative body to serve a vital transportation need of the county pursuant to this section. The entire cost of any such construction, reconstruction or improvement shall be borne by the county excepting the costs and expenses of relocating or altering private utilities, public authority utilities or utilities owned by such municipality within the desig-

nated area, and the expenses of relocating or altering public authority utilities or utilities owned by such municipality shall be considered municipal charges. For purposes of this section, the term "municipality" shall include only a city, town or incorporated village. The expenditure of money by the county for any object or purpose authorized by or pursuant to this act is hereby determined to be for a county purpose and such county, by resolution of its county legislative body, may appropriate and expend any available county moneys to pay all or part of the cost of any such object or purpose, or such cost may be financed, in whole or in part, pursuant to the local finance law.

2. The county legislative body may, by resolution, direct the county superintendent of highways to examine such highways, bridges and culverts, or sections thereof and submit a report to the county legislative body. Upon receipt thereof the county legislative body may direct the county superintendent to prepare or cause to be prepared designs, plans, specifications and estimates of the costs of construction, reconstruction or improvement. The county legislative body may thereupon adopt a resolution providing for the construction, reconstruction or improvement as submitted, or with any modifications it may approve.

3. The county legislative body may award a contract for the construction, reconstruction or improvement, as herein provided. However, no contract for such work shall be let by the county legislative body until the governing body of such municipality has appropriated funds sufficient to pay the estimated cost of relocating or altering public authority utilities or municipally owned utilities located within the designated project area as set forth in the county resolution, nor shall the county legislative body award a contract for such construction, reconstruction or improvement until all necessary rights-of-way, easements and land, title to which is not already vested in the municipality shall have been acquired by the municipality at the municipality's expense, and proposed grade crossing eliminations have been approved by the appropriate authority.

4. The construction, reconstruction or improvement authorized by the county legislative body pursuant to this section shall be performed under the direction and supervision of the county superintendent of highways.

5. Payments for construction, reconstruction or improvement authorized by the county legislative body pursuant to this section shall be made from time to time by the county treasurer upon the certificate of the county superintendent of highways.

6. Upon completion of a construction, reconstruction or improvement authorized by the county legislative body pursuant to this section, the highways, bridges or culverts, or sections thereof, shall be thereafter maintained and repaired by the municipality in which they are situated, unless the municipality and county shall, by written agreement, provide that such highways, bridges or culverts, or sections thereof, or approaches thereto shall be thereafter maintained and repaired by the county. There shall be no transfer of title to the county from the municipality therein of any highway, bridge or culvert, or section thereof constructed, reconstructed or improved pursuant to this section.

7. The provisions of this section shall not apply to counties wholly contained within a city.

- 11 Mr. Young requested permission for Mr. Mancuso and himself to go to Wisconsin to visit a Balefill. By converting the landfill to a balefill operation the life of the current landfill could be extended. Balefill is a new technology and currently there are none operational in New York State. The cost to convert could range anywhere from \$300,000 to \$1,000,000 due to size and building needs.

A motion was made by Mr. Burdick and seconded by Mr. Bennett to visit the balefill as requested. Carried.

Mr. Walchli requested a report be prepared on operational costs and potential savings.

- 12 Mr. Mancuso presented a draft of enforcement procedures for the Solid Waste Rules and Regulations. He would like them to become a part of the Solid Waste Law.

Mr. Walchli also requested signs at the transfer stations that say "misuse costs dollars".

- 13 Mr. Mancuso requested committee support on a directive for all C & D material to go directly to the landfill. Small contractors now bottleneck the stations. More control could be had by having them go directly to the landfill. The contractor would also be required to fill out a waste manifest stating where the load came from.

A motion was made by Mr. Bennett and seconded by Mr. Burdick to have the C & D go to the landfill. Carried.

- 14 Mr. Mancuso informed committee that the Town of Ossian has requested the county reconsider extending their waste disposal contract. Committee was in full agreement to terminate the contract as previously decided.

- 15 Mr. Mancuso distributed conditions that are to be placed in the contract with the Town of Caneadea for a \$4,000 payment to have a study done to have them treat the county's leachate.

A motion was made by Mr. Bennett and seconded by Mr. Sherman to have the contract prepared by the County Attorney. Carried.

RESOLUTION TO BE PREPARED BY COUNTY ATTORNEY

- 16 Mr. Young said that Vandermark Exploration sent a letter offering to sell the county 27,200 tons of bank run gravel at \$1.20 per ton. One third of the gravel could be used at the landfill and the rest could be stored at Belvidere. It would cost \$2.65 per ton to truck the gravel.

A motion was made by Mr. Burdick to offer them \$.75 per ton. Motion seconded by Mr. Bennett and Mr. Graffrath. Carried.

- 17 Mr. Young told committee that Chemung Supply was informed that Bethlehem Steel is closing.
- 18 Mr. Young updated committee on the building project. The heat in the old building should be computerized by the end of next week. Duggan & Duggan said the E911 building project should be done by the end of November.
- 19 A motion was made by Mr. Graffrath and seconded by Mr. Bennett to have a window installed in the Veterans Office. Carried.
- 20 Mr. Young requested Change Order #1 in the amount of \$1,927.00 with the Wm. T. Spaeder Co. be signed.
- 21 A motion was made by Mr. Burdick and seconded by Mr. Sherman to go into an Attorney Client. Carried.
- A motion was made by Mr. Sherman and seconded by Mr. Bennett to go out of Attorney Client Session. Carried.
- 22 Meeting adjourned.

The County Attorney has informed Mr. Braack that the county can not giveaway any property and to have the sign appraised. Mr. Braack said it was impossible to have a value placed on it because it is only useful to the theater in Wellsville. Public Works Committee approved the sale of the sign to Mr. Dan Dunning, owner of the theater for \$1.00.

A motion was made by Mr. Bennett and seconded by Mr. Burdick to donate the pipes to the Town of Centerville. Carried.

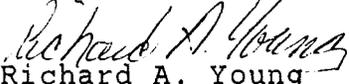

2. Baler can be used for recyclable materials to increase marketability and payback. It will increase handling efficiency.
