REGULAR SESSION
MAY 26, 2015**

CALL TO ORDER: The regular meeting of the Board of Legislators was called to order at 2:02 p.m. by Chairman Curtis W. Crandall.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE TO THE FLAG: The Pledge of Allegiance was led by former United States Air Force Senior Airman Pamela A. Fanton.

INVOCATION: The Invocation was given by Legislator Fanton.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES:

The Board meeting minutes of May 11, 2015, were amended following a motion made by Legislator Burt, seconded by Legislator Fanton, and carried to clarify Mr. Burt's comments on Resolution Intro. No. 115-15 regarding the imposition of a 1.5 percent monthly interest charge on amounts owed to Allegany County. Mr. Burt's statement should have said, "He appreciated the Treasurer's opinion during caucus. He will support because his constituents support this, and he believes it is good business." The minutes were then approved as amended following a motion made by Legislator Graves, seconded by Legislator Root, and carried.

The Committee of the Whole minutes of May 11, 2015, were approved on a motion made by Legislator Fanton, seconded by Legislator Curran, and carried.

PRIVILEGE OF THE FLOOR:

Chairman Crandall presented a certificate to Pamela A. Fanton, former United States Air Force Senior Airman (E4), in grateful appreciation of her service to our country. Ms. Fanton's service dates were from February 1997 to February 2001. Following Basic Training at Lackland Air Force Base, TX, assignments included: Wichita Falls Air Force Base, TX, and Edwards Air Force Base, California. Commendations she received included: Air Force Training Ribbon, Air Force Outstanding Unit Award, Air Force Good Conduct Medal, Air Force Longevity Service Award, and Maintenance Basic Occupational Badge. Ms. Fanton led the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag at the beginning of the meeting as part of the Veterans' Honorary Pledge of Allegiance Program.

Chairman Crandall mentioned that the Director of Veterans Service Agency annually shares a list of Allegany County veterans who have passed away. The total number listed is around 150.

Chairman Crandall recognized County Treasurer Terri Ross for being designated as Finance Officer of the Year by the NYS County Treasurers and Finance Officers' Association for 2015. Chairman Crandall expressed how proud he and his fellow legislators were of her for receiving the award. He noted that it's not coincidental that the County has improved its financial standing substantially during her time as Treasurer. He remarked that the Board relies on her financial expertise; and they weren't surprised she was selected for the honor. Ms. Ross thanked her predecessor (former County Treasurer James Mulholland) saying he was a great teacher and great leader. She also thanked her staff, both past and present, as well as all of the financial staff in our County departments.

**OPPOSITION TO NEW YORK STATE'S PLAN TO CLOSE
SKILL DEVELOPMENT CENTERS AND WORK CENTERS**

Offered by: Human Services Committee

WHEREAS, this Legislature believes that people have the right to participate in their community to their full ability; that people have the right to a supportive network of friends and advocates and that people have the responsibility to care for themselves in a safe, holistic, healthy community, and

WHEREAS, people with intellectual and other developmental disabilities currently enrolled receive funding for employment in sheltered workshops also known as skill development centers; this means that a student transitioning out of high school with a disability will be unable to pursue employment and a paycheck in this vocational setting upon graduation as in the past, and

WHEREAS, Allegany Arc's latest sheltered workshop at 50 Farnum Street in Wellsville opened in 1997; Allegany Arc has been providing employment to hundreds of individuals leading with a mission to promote community inclusion through community based supported employment, and

WHEREAS, new vocational service recipients start in sheltered workshops, many opportunities were found through vocational evaluation that are appropriate for community based employment, and

WHEREAS, some individuals have chosen to stay in sheltered work, which is the right of every American to choose where they want to work, and they are provided support and information to choose other options on a regular basis through case reviews, and

WHEREAS, the State's plan to close vocational workshops like the one operated by Allegany Arc will force those employed now to either stay home, thus removing the dignity associated with employment and taking away a vital step to community based employment, and

WHEREAS, the United States Supreme Court's decision in *Olmstead v. L.C.* recognized the right of individuals with developmental disabilities who are currently in a sheltered workshop to remain in that setting if they wish to do so, now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED:

1. That the Allegany County Board of Legislators does hereby oppose New York State's plan to close sheltered workshops, thus removing this important step towards community based supported employment.

2. That the Allegany County Board of Legislators is requesting New York State's plan to close the sheltered workshops be rescinded and allow the funding of these work centers to continue allowing them to stay open and continue giving those working there the self-advocacy of choosing where they want to work.

3. That certified copies of this Resolution be forwarded to Governor Andrew Cuomo; Lieutenant Governor Kathy Hochul; Congressman Tom Reed; Senator Catharine Young; Assemblyman Joseph M. Giglio; New York State Association of Counties; Inter-County Association of Western New York; Allegany Arc; NYSARC; and OPWDD.

A motion was made by Legislator Root, seconded by Legislator Jessup, and adopted on a roll call vote of 13 Ayes, 0 Noes, 2 Absent, that the audit of claims, totaling \$2,822,685.50, including prepaid expenses, be approved for payment as recommended by the County Administrator. (*Allegany County's Local Dollar Share of the NYS Medicaid Program paid year-to-date is \$3,863,720.*)

ADJOURNMENT: The meeting was adjourned at 2:44 p.m. on a motion made by Legislator Graves, seconded by Legislator Curran, and carried.
